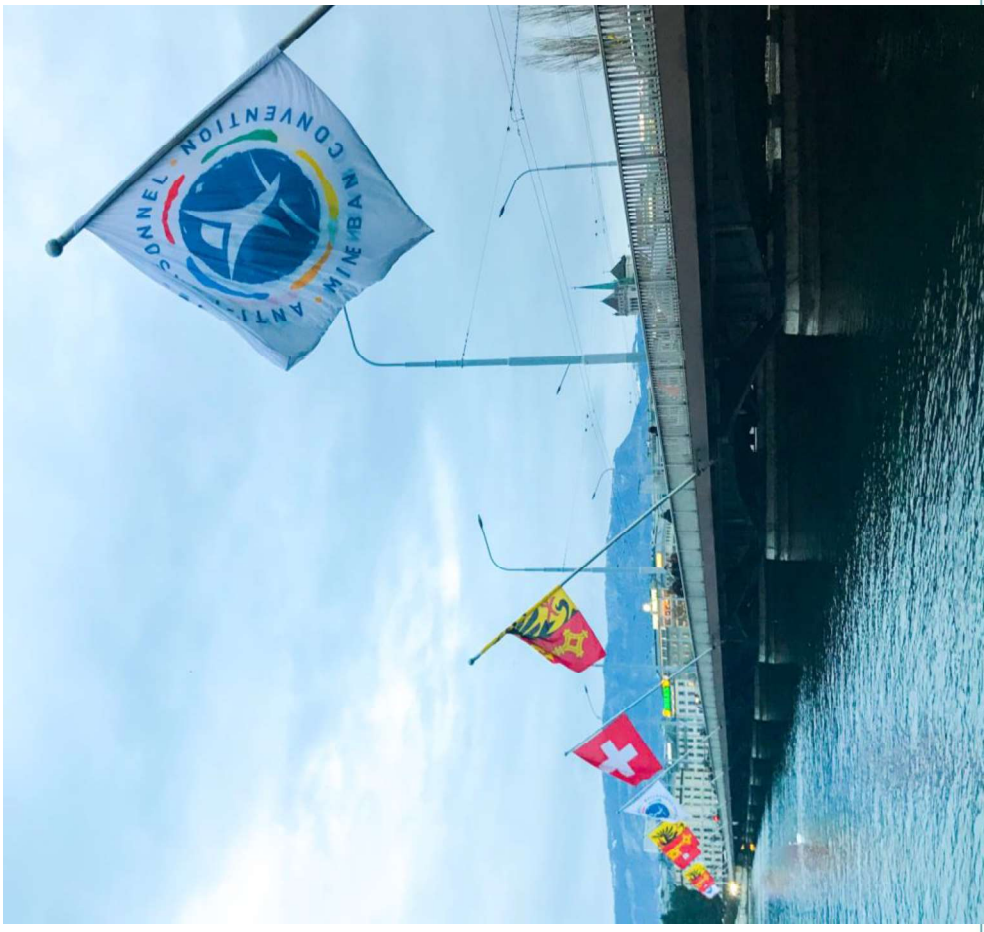
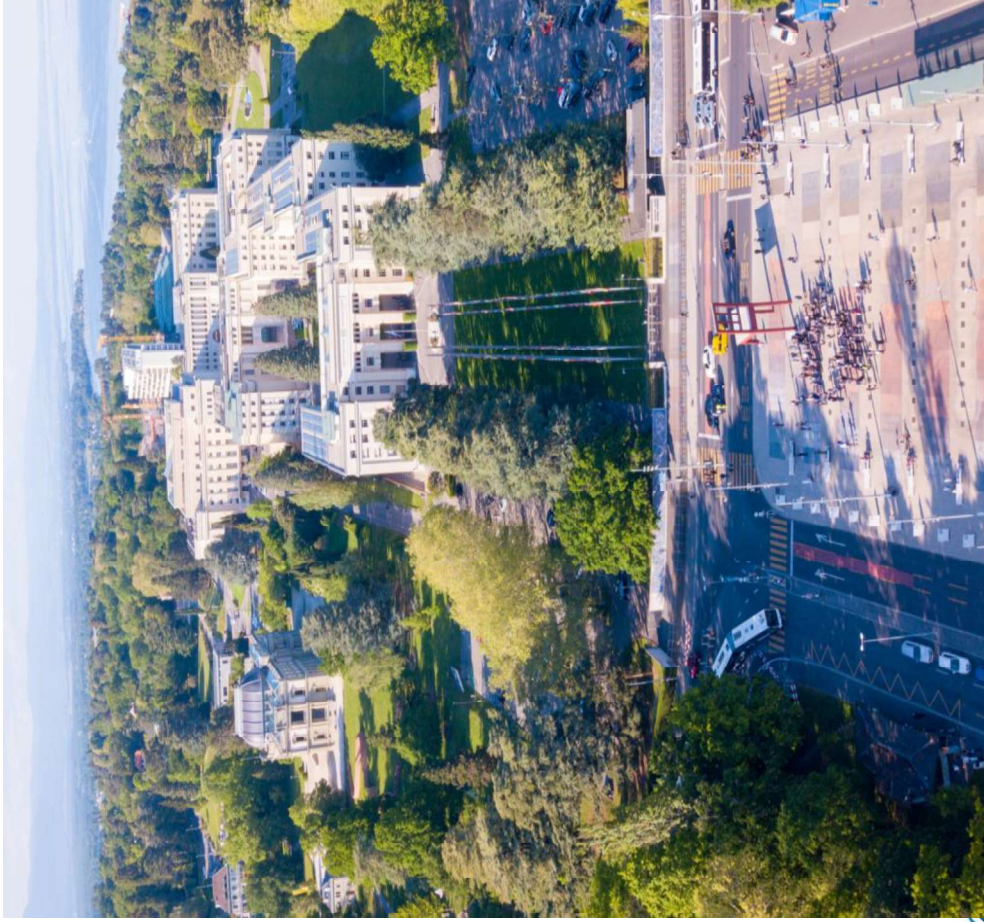


International Cooperation And Assistance



Committee on the Enhancement of Cooperation and Assistance - Purpose

To assist the States Parties in the full implementation of Article 6 of the Convention, in line with their reaffirmation of ending the suffering and casualties caused by anti-personnel mines is a shared commitment



Committee on the Enhancement of Cooperation and Assistance - Mandate

- Promote cooperation and assistance (organising or encouraging the organisation of multilateral, regional or national dialogues on cooperation and assistance, in Geneva or elsewhere)
- Facilitate the fostering of partnerships between States Parties seeking to receive assistance and those in a position to provide such assistance
- Coordinate with other implementation mechanisms established by the States Parties (individualised approach)
- Review relevant information provided by States Parties on the implementation of the commitments of the OAP
- Consider matters related to gender and diversity
- Present preliminary observations and conclusions and recommendations



OAP –Cooperation and Assistance

Action 42 – 47

- Commit the resources needed to meet Convention obligations and explore all possible alternative and/or innovative sources of funding;
- Develop resource mobilisation plans and use all mechanisms disseminate information on challenges and requirements for assistance (Article 7 transparency reports, individualised approach);
- Strengthen national coordination including by ensuring regular dialogue and consider, where relevant, establishing an appropriate national platform;
- Provide assistance to other States Parties in the implementation of their obligations under the Convention, in line with their development policies;
- States Parties in a position to provide assistance will coordinate their support for the effective implementation of Convention obligations by affected States Parties;
- Continuously explore opportunities for cooperation,(international, regional and bilateral, cooperation between affected States Parties or South-to-South) with a view to voluntary sharing of best practices and lessons learned. Cooperation of this kind may include making mutually supporting clearance commitments in border areas.
