Statements by the Kingdom of Belgium

Madam President,

Belgium aligns itself with the statements delivered by the **European Union** and wishes to make the following remarks in her national capacity.

(mine clearance)

- Belgium remains **committed to our objective** of a world free of antipersonnel mines by 2025, but also a world free of new or unassisted mine victims.
- My Country urges all States Parties to **step up their efforts** to fulfill their obligations under the Convention ahead of the **Review Conference** in 2019.
- Belgium **condemns the use** by anyone, state or non-state actors, of antipersonnel mines, included the use of IEDs.
- My country is gravely concerned by the increase in the number of mine victims. According to the Landmine Monitor, the sharp increase observed in 2015 continued to rise in 2016. Belgium deplores also that the majority of casualties to be civilians hit by APMs.
- The rise in the number of victims has been particularly acute in Irak and Syria as
 a result of the heavy dissemination of improvise antipersonnel mines by Daesh
 that prevent the safe return of IDPs and hinders the reconstruction of whole
 regions.
- Belgium has been very active in the fight against IEDs and chaired a UN WG coordinated by UNMAS on the development of UN IEDDS (Improvised Explosive Devices Disposal Standards). My country deems it important to provide for efficient, safe, and cost-effective solutions to counter the risk posed by improvised antipersonnel mines.
