



## Need for Specific Act on the Prohibition of Anti-Personnel Mines

- No existing legislation covering landmines existing law (only explosive ordnance) Defence & Police Acts
- ▶ Need have specific law to deter breach of Convention
- ➤ To facilitate the establishment of a legal entity to implement the Convention

## Highlights of Act No. 16 of 2003

- Definitions: PART I
  - Section 2. (a) & (b) (i) (v) describes what is considered to be an anti-personnel mine

### • Extra- Territorial Jurisdiction: PART III

- Section 9 What act is prohibited and penalties thereof
- Section 10 Jurisdiction of courts nos.1 3
  - Criminal whether or not committed in Zambia

## Highlights of Act No. 16 of 2003 (continued)

#### • Fact Finding Missions – Part V

- Provided detailed provisions under this Section
  - Who accompanies mission?
  - What can be done?
  - powers of the director & the director of public prosecutions

#### • Enforcement Provisions – Part IX

- Power of inspection and entry
- Right of search
- Power to arrest
- Obstruction and immunity of an officer

#### Challenges in the Domestication Process

- 1. Lack of a formal structure (MAC) to advocate for the process
- 2. Inadequate technical/legal expertise at national level
- 3. Defence not clear on the true implications of being a State Party

# **Possible Way Forward**

✓ Cooperation: Sub-regional, regional and global levels
- Cooperation can be north-south, South –South (SADC) & Multilateral (UNMAS)

- ✓ Resources: Key to ensuring timely adherence
- ✓ Assistance: States in a position to provide assistance should actively collaborate with others that have challenges (financial, technical, legal, material)

✓ Advocacy
