

Cambodian Statement on the APM retained for training in 2012
Geneva, 25 May 2012

Thanks Madame co-chairs for the floor to update the AP mines retained under Article 3 of the Convention. Referring to the Cartagena Action Plan #56, 57, Cambodia had reported to the SP under Article 7 based on the operators' reports that 1118 APM has been retained for training in 2012, which 1052 from CMAC (with types identified available here), 6 from MAG and 60 from HALO Trust. Cambodia does not require retention of live mines for its training in mine detection, mine clearance or mine destruction techniques. All mine bodies used in these programs have had their fuzes removed and destroyed and are no longer capable of being used.

The reason on why Cambodia needs such types and amount of APMs is that recently, the research and development from various agencies have been carried out in Cambodia. Moreover, the needs for refresher training on EOD teams, thru out the programs remained valid. In addition, during this year, the CMAA will create the MDD/EDD testing site which will need to obtain around 85 APMs into the 100 boxes to accredit to all MDD/EDD in the Country.
