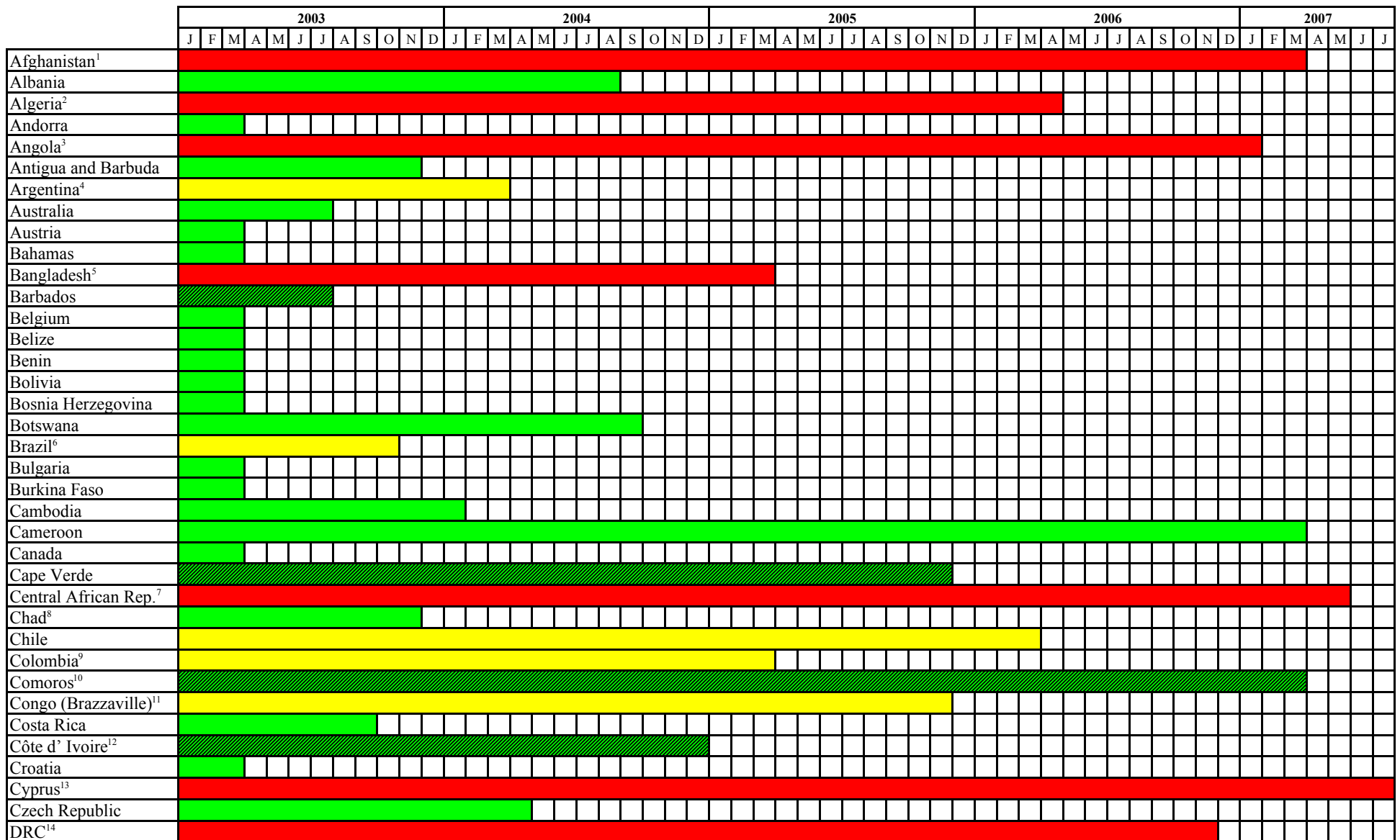

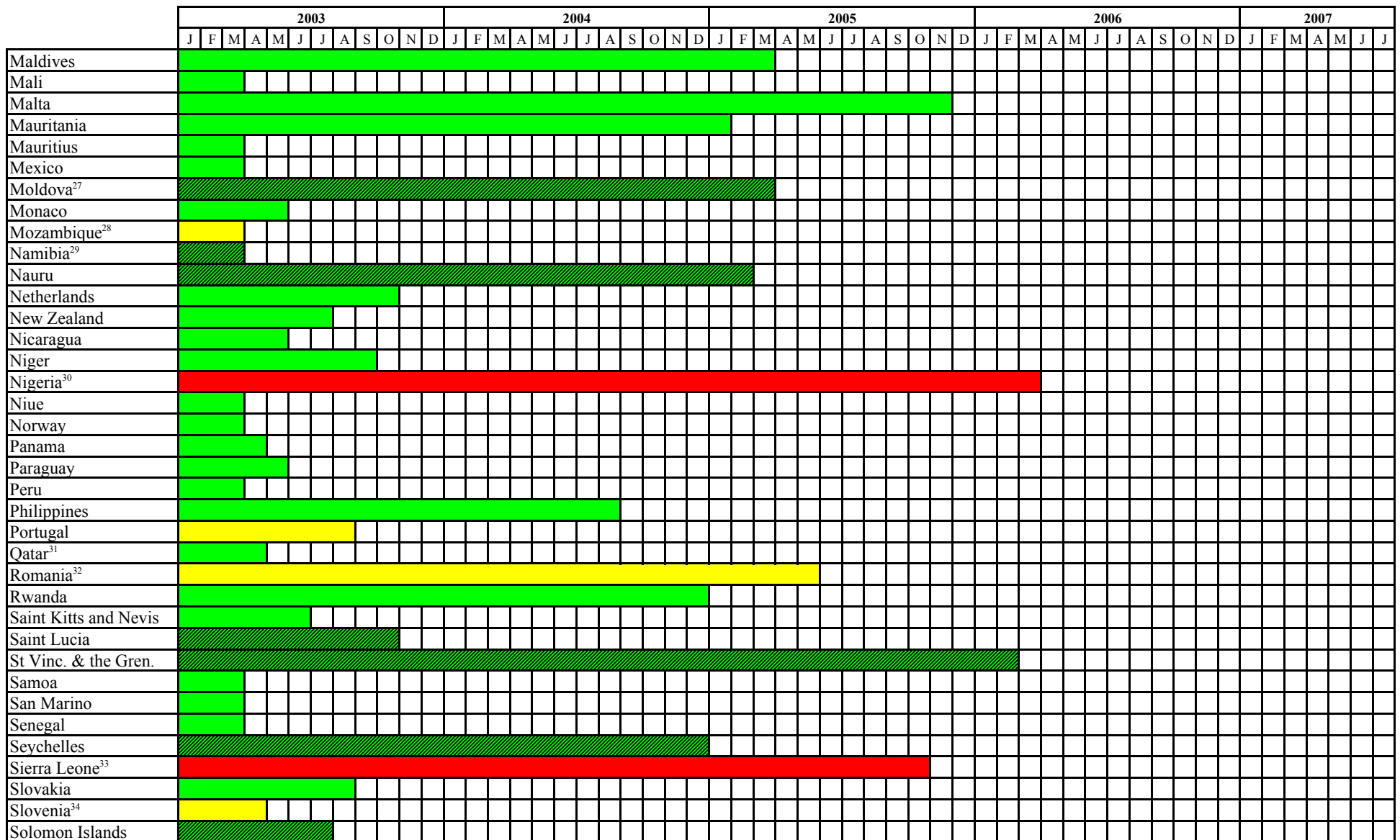

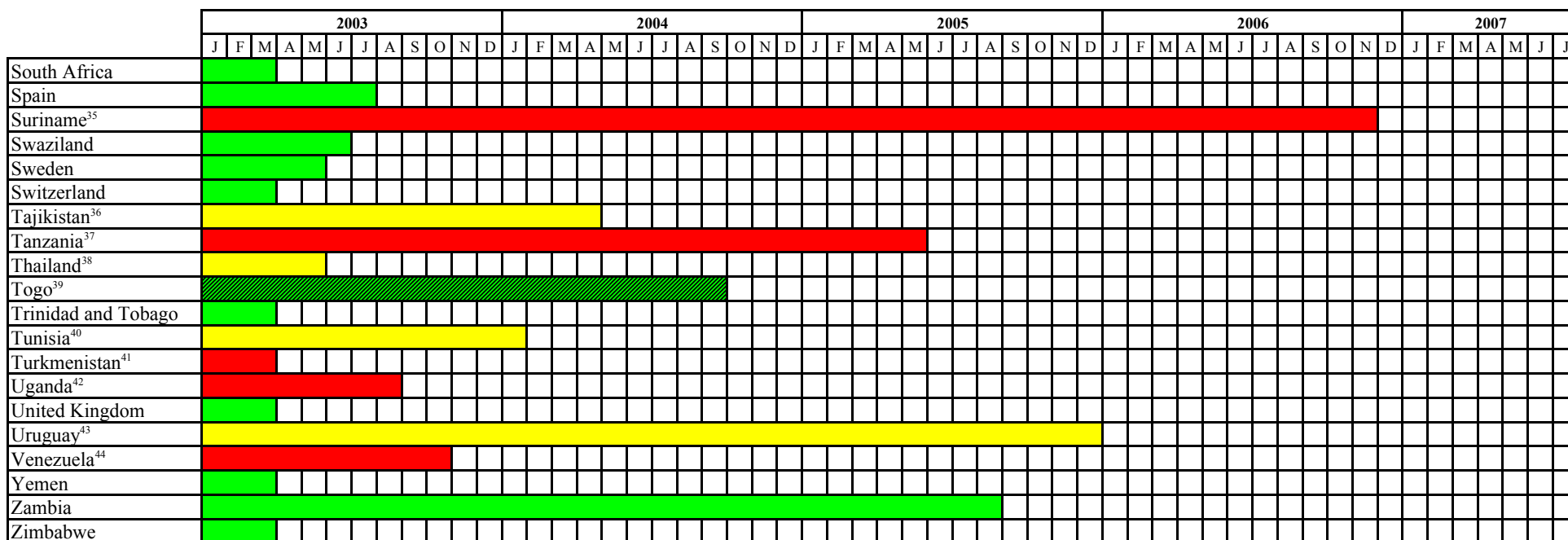

### Time-lines for the implementation of Article 4



- Key:
- States Parties that reported they either have completed stockpile destruction or, have never held mine stockpiles.
  - States Parties for which Article 7 information has not been made available but are presumed to not hold stockpiles (based upon other information sources).
  - States Parties that are in the process of destroying stockpiles.
  - States Parties that have not begun stockpile destruction or, if Article 7 information has not been made available (or has not yet been required) are presumed to possess stockpiles and have not yet begun destruction.

<sup>4</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (July 23, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 96,513 mines and that destruction is in progress.

<sup>5</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (August 28, 2002) indicates stockpiles totaling 204,227 mines.

<sup>6</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (April 30, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 30,748 mines and that destruction is in progress.

<sup>7</sup> First Article 7 report not yet due.

<sup>8</sup> On February 3, 2003, Chad reported that destruction was complete.

<sup>9</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (August 6, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 20,312 mines and that the Ministry of Defence and Armed Forces is in the process of developing a destruction plan.

<sup>10</sup> While First Article 7 report is not yet due, Landmine Monitor has indicated that stockpiled AP mines are not held.

<sup>11</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (September 12, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 5,090 mines and that destruction is planned for 2003.

<sup>12</sup> Article 7 reports not submitted. Landmine Monitor suggests that Cote d' Ivoire is likely not to have stockpiles.

<sup>15</sup> Initial Article 7 report (January 16, 2003) indicates stockpiles total 4,184 and that destruction is in progress.

<sup>17</sup> Article 7 reports have not been submitted.

<sup>18</sup> Initial Article 7 report (due July 31, 2002) not yet available.

<sup>20</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (June 19, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 4,997 mines and that destruction is in progress.

<sup>21</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (April 24, 2002) indicates total stockpiles 436,837 mines. In its CCW APII Article 13 report submitted on 19 November 2002, Japan indicated that destruction would be completed by the the end of February 2003.

<sup>22</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (November 27, 2002) indicates that destruction of its remaining 15,790 mines will be completed in April 2003.

<sup>23</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (June 4, 2002) indicates a stockpile of 35,774 mines .

<sup>25</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (June 25, 2002) indicates a stockpiles total 42,871 mines and that destruction is in progress.

<sup>27</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (April 8, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 12,121 mines. A news report dated 26 November 2002 stated that destruction was complete.

<sup>28</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (March 14, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 37,366 mines. At the 4MSP, Mozambique declared that it had destroyed 17,500 mines and expected to destroy the rest by March 2003.

<sup>29</sup> While Article 7 reports have not been submitted, Landmine Monitor has indicated that stockpiled AP mines are not held.

<sup>30</sup> Initial Article 7 report (due August 28, 2002) not yet available.

<sup>31</sup> Article 7 reports have not been submitted. However, Qatar indicated to the 2001-2002 and 2002-2003 Co-Chairs of the Standing Committee on Stockpile Destruction that it did not have stockpiles.

<sup>32</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (April 10, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 918,920 mines and 130,474 mines already destroyed.

<sup>33</sup> Initial Article 7 report (due March 30, 2002) not submitted. Landmine Monitor indicates less than 1,000 mines held.

<sup>34</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (April 16, 2002) indicates a stockpile of 156,534 mines and that destruction is in progress.

<sup>35</sup> Initial Article 7 report not yet due. Landmine Monitor indicates that "it is not known if Suriname holds a stockpile of antipersonnel mines."

<sup>36</sup> Tajikistan indicated to the 2002-2003 Co-Chairs of the Standing Committee on Stockpile Destruction that a plan is in place to destroy stockpiled AP mines.

<sup>37</sup> Initial Article 7 report is currently being processed.

<sup>38</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (April 30, 2002) indicates stockpiles of 224,138 mines and that destruction is in progress.

<sup>39</sup> Article 7 reports have not been submitted. Landmine Monitor indicates very small stockpile retained for training purposes.

## Time-lines for the implementation of Article 4

<sup>40</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (October 4, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 11,575 mines and that destruction is in progress.

<sup>41</sup> Article 7 report indicates an apparent request to extend the deadline for stockpile destruction and a stockpile of 761,782 mines. In a letter to the 2001-2002 Co-Chairs of the Standing Committee on Stockpile Destruction, Turkmenistan said it now only has around 250,000 mines and plans to meet its deadline.

<sup>42</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (May 24, 2002) indicates a stockpile of 6,782 AP mines.

<sup>43</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (December 3, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 1,928 mines and that destruction is in progress.

<sup>44</sup> Most recent Article 7 report (September 10, 2002) indicates stockpiles total 22,136 mines.
