



























































Ottawa Convention Article 2 Definitions



Mine: A munition <u>designed</u> to be placed under, on or near the ground or other surface area and to be exploded by the presence, proximity or contact of a person or a vehicle.

Anti-personnel mine: A mine <u>designed</u> to be exploded by the presence, proximity or contact of a person"

However some translations (e.g. Russian Version) omits the word 'designed' this can lead to differences of interpretation of 'what is in' and 'what is out'.

Ottawa Convention Article 2 NAMSA / NATO View



- ☐ An APL should only be excluded from a stockpile if:
 - ► It was <u>designed</u> with dual capability (i.e. both victim and operator initiated) e.g. MRUD, MON series

And

- Ability to be victim operated has been verifiably and permanently removed
 - > May require periodic re-verification

And

- ▶ A substantive justification exists:
 - Operational / tactical basis:
 - Directional mines
 - Omni-directional mines
 - Technical basis
- APL that were <u>only</u> designed to be victim operated should not be excluded even if modified
