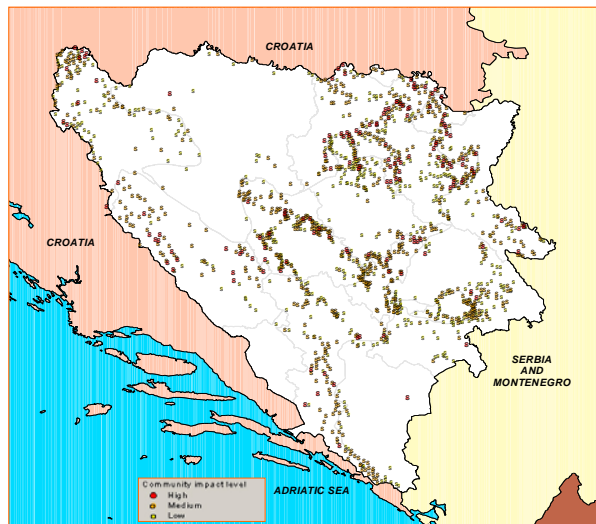

### GENERAL ASSESSMENT OF MINE SITUATION

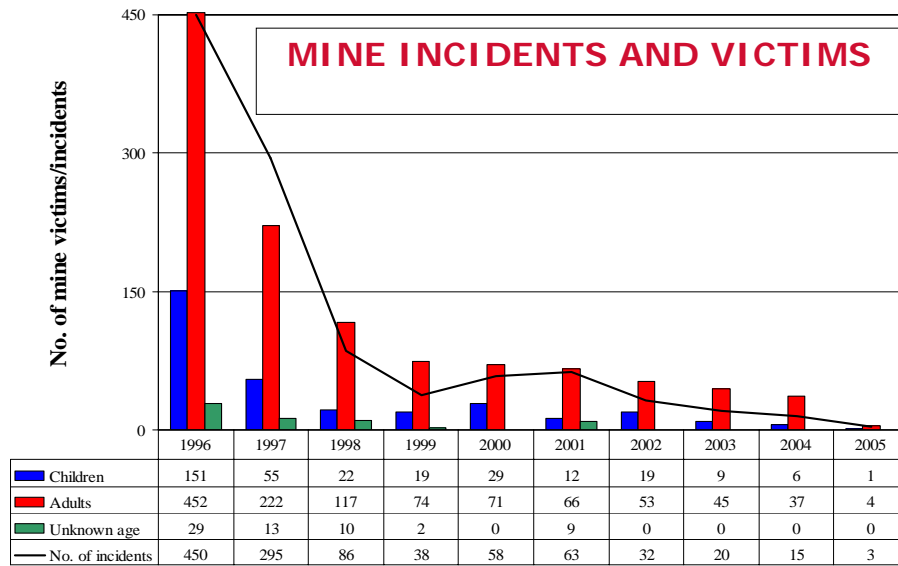
#### *Impact level Categories of the 1366 impacted communities*

##### Conclusion:

- **154 communities - high impact** areas; 100,000 estimated population.
- **696 communities - medium impact** areas; 594,000 estimated population
- **516 communities - low impact** areas; 681,477 estimated population
- **Total: 1366 Impacted communities** 1,375,807 people; ¼ of estimated pop.
- **Mine contamination is widespread, low density, and random in pattern**



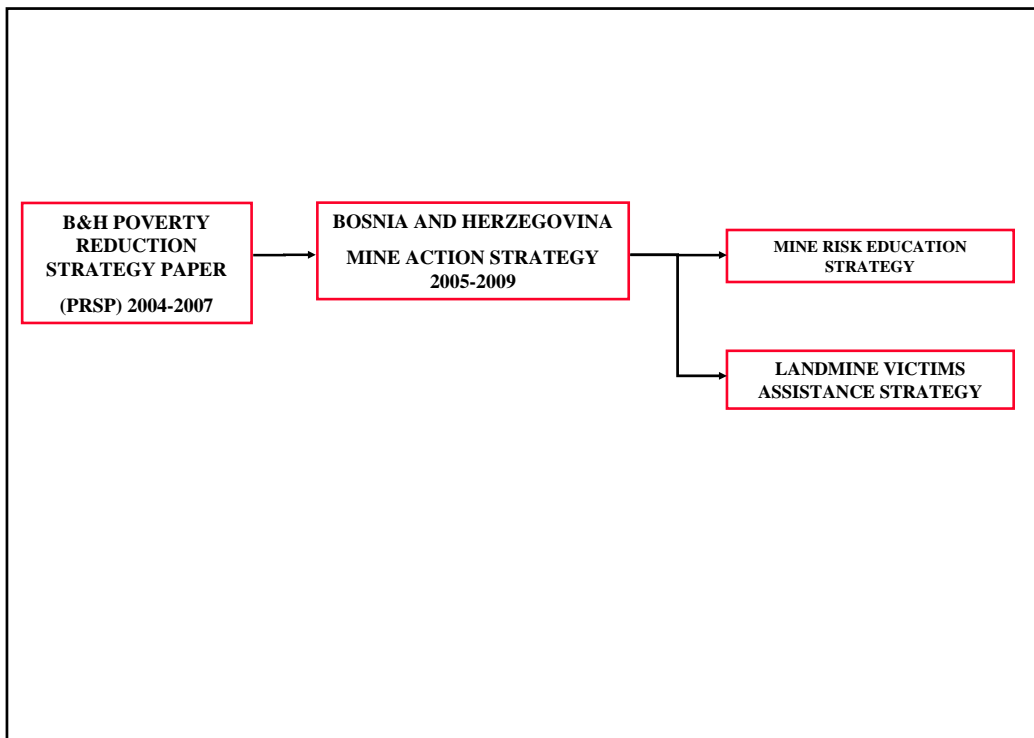
GENERAL ASSESSMENT OF MINE SITUATION



**Children are 21.15% of total victims.**

**4.876** landmine/UXO victims registered since 1992 till April 2005





## Information level and Database

- **Current data sets on landmine victims:**
  - Incompatible, inefficient and dispersed throughout various databases
- **Goals to be achieved:**
  - Create and established a standardize information system
  - Establish a data gathering system, fill in data base, develop the reporting system and analyze the results
  - Design and publish a web site on LMVA issues

- Economic independence-top priority for 30% of the interviewed mine victims

## **Strategies goals and objectives**

- By the end of 2008, work on changes and amendments of the existing legal regulations
- Through the establishment of the working bodies, improve the coordination between all LMVA organisations
- Establish the standardized information system for landmine victims
- Strengthen the rehabilitation system in B&H
- Develop the quality standards for ortho-prosthetic and medical rehabilitation
- Professional development, pre-qualification and professional training for mine victims. Develop the plan of promotion of enterprises and businesses that will provide employment for mine victims
