

## Q. 1: What is the plan to destroy all mines in mined areas

- Determine the scope and impact of the mine/ERW contamination problem through a Nation wide Landmine Impact Survey, nearly completion
- 2. Allocate enough resources from the national budget (GONU and GOSS) to fund mine action activities in the country
- 3. Build necessary mine/ERW national clearance assets to clear mines in mined areas
- Work with the UN and other international organizations to clear mines in 80% of high priority mined areas
- 5. Clear all mines in mined areas by 2014

# Q. 2 What has been achieved since April 2007 National mine/ERW clearance assets:

- Clearance/verification of 446 Km long Babanusa-Wau Railway line
- Clearance/verification of 234 Km high priority roads in Eastern Sudan
- Clearance/verification of 140 Km high priority road between Malakal and Ayod



#### National mine/ERW clearance assets ...

- 149 anti vehicle mines destroyed
- 37 antipersonnel mines destroyed
- more than 25,000 pieces of explosive devices destroyed

#### Q. 4 Challenges, impediments

- Lack of enough funding,
- Lack of modern technologies, experties
- Lack of equipment, such as Caspers, flails, and other heavy machinery,
- Lack of enough human resources
- Logistical difficulties, long rainy seasons,
- Political complexities and uncertainties



# Q.5 State Financial and Technical Means?

- GoNU and GOSS provided more than US\$ 8 equipment and operations
- Mine action included in the budget of GONU and GOSS
- Recruited more than 120 management and field staff on state pay roll
- Trained 260 deminers in Nairobi and in China
- 110 deminers deployed to the field
- Procurement of 3 Graders, 5 Dozers and 12 Off Road vehicles, 2 water tankers, 2 heavy duty trucks for field operations



#### Q. 6, Priorities for Assistance

- Technical and financial assistance in strengthening/devel oping national capacities
- Specialized/focused training in quality assurance, monitoring, information management, demining,



### Q. 6, Priorities for Assistance..

- Equipment (Vehicles, flail machines, mine detectors)
- Technical and financial support to the implementation of the transition plan



# Q. 7 Mine action by UN and External Organizations

- Mine action is still largely being coordinate/managed by the UN,
- A large number of external organizations are engaged in mine action activities

# Q. 8 Mine Action Transition to National Ownership

- The GONU, GOSS and UN have embarked on a mine action transition planning process
- Three workshops have been held since Feb 2008
- A mine action transition framework has been developed
- Mine action transition plans are being developed with a deadline of 2011 for full transition and full national ownership
- Mine action capacity development plans in support of the transition process are being developed
