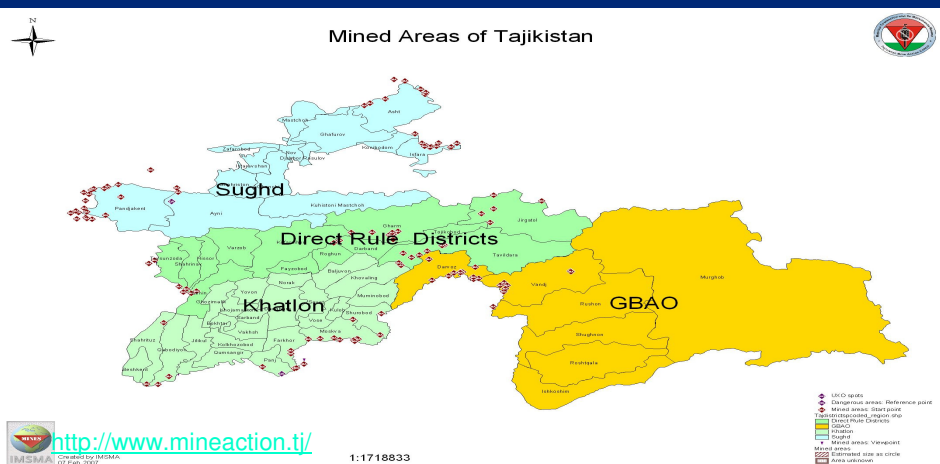

What are the plans of your Government to clear and/or provide facilities for the clearance of all AP mines, located under the jurisdiction or control of your Government in the nearest future?

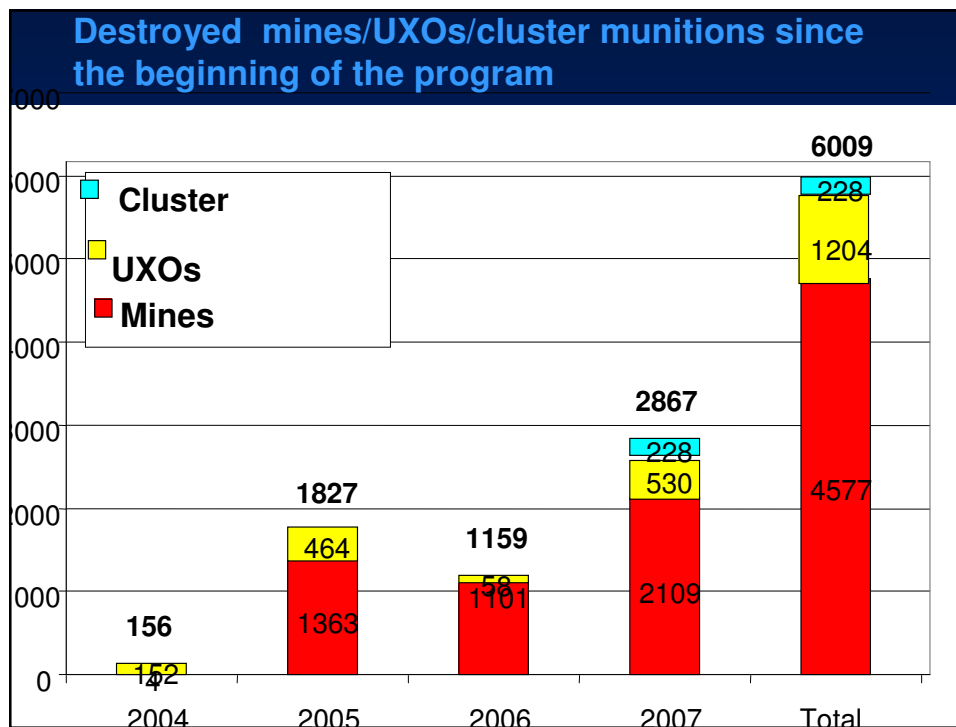
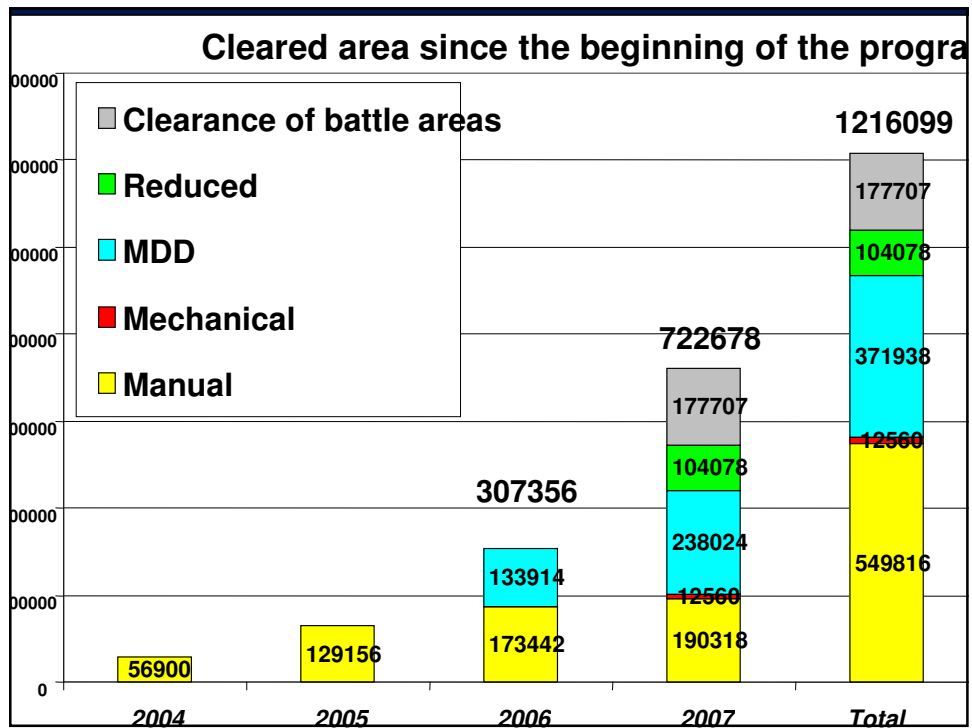
- The mine action program in Tajikistan is being undertaken in accordance with the Five Year Mine Action Strategic Plan for 2006-2010 which was approved by CIIHL (Commission on the Implementation of International Humanitarian Law) on 27 July 2006. Our long-term strategic plan is in line with our commitment to Ottawa Convention.

What are the achievements of your Government to fulfill the national program since it was last submitted to the Standing Committees ?

Since the last Intersessional meeting

We -

- Cleared : more than **750 000** sqm.;
- Found & Destroyed : more than **2400** mines & more than 758 UXOs/CM;
- Reduced SHAs : more than 17 mln. sqm.;
- Handed over : 13 cleared mine fields;

(3 handlers and 2 dogs in each team)

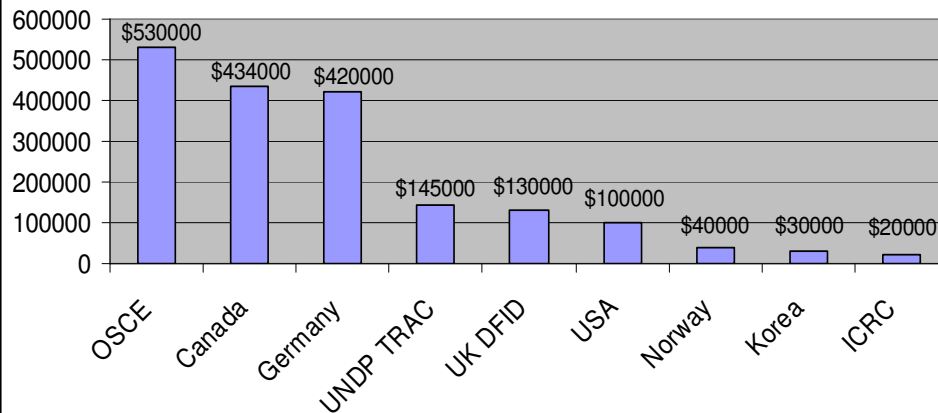

What work remains for your State to carry out the obligations of destruction or providing destruction of all AP mines which are under jurisdiction or the control of your State?

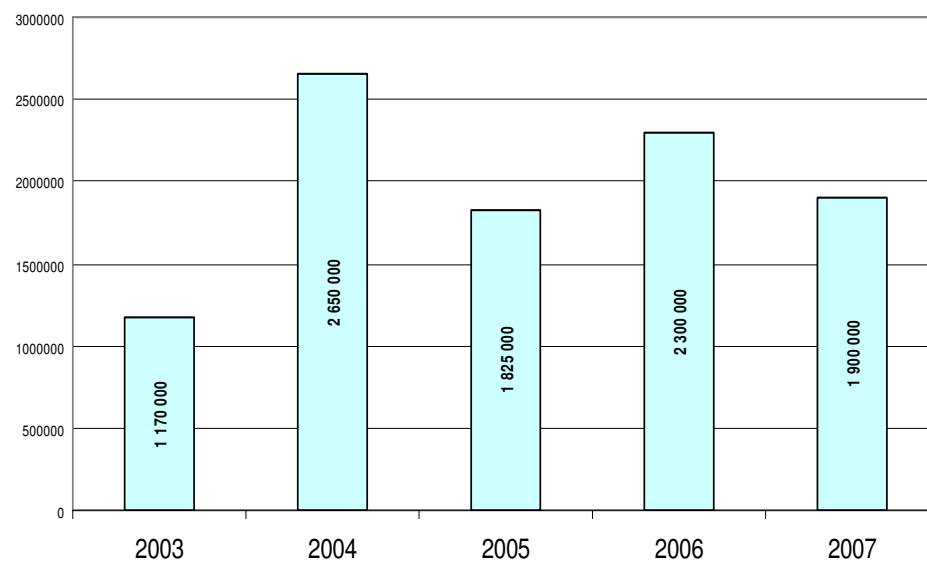
