Progresses achieved in ensuring the fulfillment of the goals set forth for landmine victims In the coordination sector

In this sector, the elaboration of an Integrated Action Plan intensified:

- •Gathering of all existing data to support the establishment of a governing entity to coordinate and monitor protection policies for all Disabled Persons.
- The coordination of strategies and sectoral plans within the mine victim assistance pillar at national level; Aiming at:
- 1. Implementing the provincial plans and evaluate the results and;
- 2. Support the provincial coordination and identify the operational and technical needs to better provide assistance to landmine victims in each locality.

In the sector of health, education, services, rehabilitation, legislation and accessibility

- Production of about 2648 prosthesis;
- •Integration of 12 orthopedic technicians to improve the quality of assistance at the 11 orthopaedic centres in the country;
- •Signature of an agreement between the National Program for Physical Rehabilitation from MINSA and the National Institute for the Reintegration of Ex-combatents to improve the services of disabled civilians and ex-combatants;
- •Preparation of a National Meeting on Special Education to improve the quality of education for landmine victims and other people with disability and special educational needs;
- •An increase of disable Persons into tertiary education.
- •Preparation for signature of a partnership agreement between CNIDAH, MAPESS Plastic Artists Union for the consolidation of a Ceramic Project involving 30 women victims of landmines;
- •Miss Landmine beauty pageant with the participation of 18 landmine victims, representing the 18 provinces;
- •Committment of the country with the ratification of the Convention on the Rights of People with Disability;
- •Documental compilation on assistance and protection of landmine victims and other disabled persons to support review the existing legislation and the definition / redefinition of current policies;
- Sectoral meetings for the implementation of a Survivors Network.
- •Consolidation of the Landmine Victims Survey Project to get the real figure of landmine victims, their geographic distribution, accident circunstances, available services and their needs;
- •Intensification of training and socio-economic reintegration of 10300 victims of mines in agriculture, shoe repair, cut and sewing, electronics, small business management among others.
- •An increase to micro-credit access for Disable Persons. Cont.

- •Awareness raising on Public and Private institutions has led to an increase on the fulfillment of the law 21/82 which foresees a 2% of work vacancies for people with Disability.
- •Reduction on architectural barriers from public and private institutions, and new buildings are incorporating these standards.
- •Engagement from architecture departments from public and private universities to fully eliminate all architectural and social barriers.
