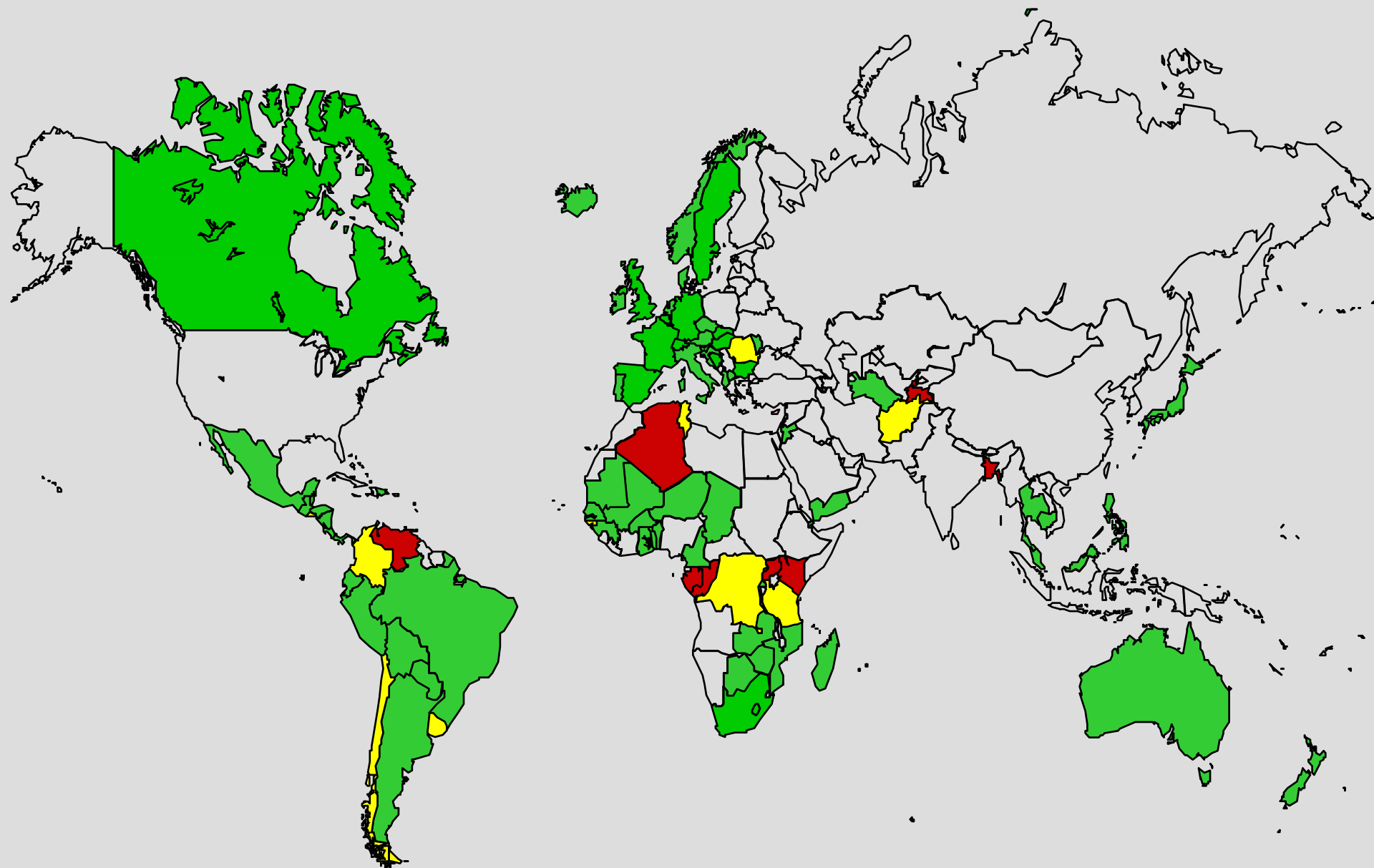

Progress in Stockpile Destruction

- 30 million antipersonnel mines destroyed by SP
- Destruction complete in 48 countries
 - Recently completed by Brazil, Chad, Djibouti, Jordan, Macedonia FYR, Mozambique, Portugal, Slovenia, Thailand, and Turkmenistan
- Officially declared absence of stocks in 45 countries
- Destruction underway in 11 countries
 - **1 has a deadline in 2003 (El Salvador)**
- Destruction not underway in 8 countries
 - **2 have deadlines in 2003 (Uganda & Venezuela)**
- Stocks not officially declared by 16 countries
 - LATE transparency measures reports
 - **7 have deadlines in 2003**

Mines Retained for Training and Development

- 54 countries not retaining any mines
 - 12 of these countries once stockpiled mines
- 11 countries retaining more than 5,000 mines
 - Turkmenistan (69,200), Brazil (16,545), Algeria (15,030), Bangladesh (15,000), Sweden (13,948), Japan (11,223), Australia (7,513), Croatia (6,746), Zambia (6,691), Chile (6,245), Mauritania (5,728)
- 30 countries retaining between 1,000 and 5,000 mines
- 20 countries retaining less than 1,000 mines
- 18 countries have yet to announce their intentions
