wish to congratulate you on your election as President of our meeting of pledge our full support in your work. I also take this opportunity to ank the outgoing President H.E. Minister Prak Sokhonn (Sokon) for his adership of our work during the past year.

The Republic of Cyprus (RoC) is applying for a 3-year extension due objective difficulties it faces in reporting the whole of its territory clear anti-personnel mines.

Since July and August 1974 there is a part of its territory that is under e control of a foreign army and in this area the government of the RoC ses not exercise effective control and has no free access.

Cyprus signed the Convention in 1997. The Convention entered into rce in 2003.

Immediately, a National Plan for clearance was drawn up. I will not e you with numbers. We have submitted tables and figures with our pplication for extension which show the exact number of mine-fields that ere cleared and mines that were removed in the 9 years since the onvention entered into force for Cyprus and which constitute a very irge percentage of the mine fields identified in the National Plan. In rief, by July 2013, namely at the end of the 10-year period provided for learance, Cyprus will be able to report that all the areas under its control rill have been cleared of anti-personnel mines.

This is the Buffer Zone, as well, is clear of anti-personnel mines. This is area of approximately 3% of Cypriot territory in which a United ations Peace Keeping Force is operating under a mandate/from the eneral Assembly of the UN.

In order to better understand the situation on the ground, it is useful schematically divide the territory of the ROC into three areas. All three eas are part of the territory internationally recognized as under the wine free risdiction of the RoC, as defined in International law at the time of dependence in 1960. So, Cyprus feels obliged in the context of the onvention to report all three areas.

There is one area, consisting about two thirds (63%) of the territory hich is under the effective control of the government of the RoC. By ıly 2013 this area will be completely free of anti-personnel mines. The econd area, consisting about 3% of the territory, as I have already dicated, comprises the Buffer Zone. This area has also been cleared in poperation with the United Nations Peace Keeping Force and ternational partners. Financing for this part has been provided by ternational donors and primarily by the EU.

However, Cyprus is unable to report on the remainder one third of its erritory, which is under the control of a foreign troups. The government f the RoC does not have access to this area and does not have reliable Iformation on the state of mine-fields in this area.

We are asking for a 3-year extension. When political developments rill allow, the clearance of this area will not take that long, given the at the remaining anti-personnel mine-fields are not spread out roughout the territory, but are concentrated in the strip of land adjacent the Buffer Zone. We are working hard for these political developments become a reality and we hope that soon this will be the case and that e will be able to report full implementation of the Convention in the hole territory.
