

IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT UNIT 2016 BUDGET 20 November 2015

Introduction

The following budget and activities are to be read in conjunction with the ISU's four year work plan and budget covering the period of 2016-2019.

2016 AP Mine Ban Convention ISU Budget

Staff costs

The 2016 budget is intended to cover the salaries and related social costs to 2.6 full-time-equivalent staff. These positions include one full-time director and two professional officers (totalling 2.6 full-time-equivalent staff).

Travel costs

The 2016 budget is intended to cover the costs of twelve (12) missions by ISU staff, in total including two (2) missions to support preparations for the Fifteenth Meeting of the States Parties, seven (7) missions for mine clearance support, and three (3) missions for the purpose of liaison and / or participating in conferences or similar events. As a rule staff travels in economy class regardless of duration or length of the flight. The estimated cost of these 12 missions is based on actual costs of missions in 2015 and totals CHF 32,000.

Communication, public relations and other implementation support costs

Other implementation support costs include matters such as room rentals for committee meetings (when cost-free options are not available), catering for lunch-time meetings, working translations of request for extended mine clearance deadline when these are required by States Parties, ICT support, publications, etc.

Financial Security Buffer

With regard to the establishment of a financial security buffer as defined in the decision of the 14th Meeting of States Parties on strengthening financial governance and transparency within the ISU the 2016 budget includes a first installment of [365.000 CHF].

GICHD support to the ISU

Costs for infrastructure, logistics and administrative services in support of the ISU (i.e., office rent and supplies, information technology and telecommunications, website management, travel services, human resources management, insurance, financial management, and contract and document management), are not included in this budget. These costs are covered by the GICHD general budget, on the basis of funds provided by Switzerland. The value of this support is estimated at approximately CHF 272'000 in 2016. The estimated value of these activities is a result of monitoring by the GICHD of actual levels of support provided.



While costs associated with providing substantive support to the Presidency and Committees in preparing the two day Intersessional are covered by the ISU budget, costs totalling CHF 102'000 related to facility rental, interpretation (Arabic, English, French, Russian and Spanish) and conference management concerning the Intersessional Meetings are covered by the GICHD budget, again on the basis of funds provided by Switzerland.

While costs associated with providing strategic direction to the Sponsorship Programme are covered by the ISU budget, costs related to the administration of the Sponsorship Programme, including travel and accommodation services as well as reporting and auditing are covered by the GICHD, again on the basis of funds provided by Switzerland. The value of these costs is projected to be CHF 20,000 in 2016, based on the assumption that approximately 40 delegates would be sponsored in total.

A portion of ISU staff time is consumed in providing value-added to the GICHD (which is not discounted from the GICHD's extrapolation of costs associated with hosting the ISU). The intended results of activities in this area include that the GICHD's support activities are enhanced through the contribution of ISU expertise.
