Madame President,

Excellencies, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Destruction of anti personal mines is a task that Afghanistan must accomplish and must

complete by March 2007 according to the Ottawa Treaty.

As the deadline for the destruction of all stockpiled anti-personnel mines approaches, we

can say with confidence that all known stockpiles in Afghanistan are or will be destroyed

almost immediately. However, Afghanistan is a rugged country with many factions and

remote villages.

Despite the challenges that come hand in hand with stockpile destruction, Afghanistan

can still boast great progress in this area. Since Afghanistan joined the Ottawa

Convention, 462,206 anti-personnel mines have been destroyed. Since the last meeting of

the state parties in Zagreb we have destroyed more than 400,000 anti personnel mines. A

total of 2,833 anti-personnel mines have been retained for training and the accreditation

of mine detection dogs.

We are hopeful to reporting higher figures of destroyed stockpiles as the March 2007

deadline approaches. Survey and destruction teams are working hard and under difficult

security conditions, to discover more Anti Personnel Mines caches.

We are thankful to the support of our donors for making this progress possible and hope

that we will have the continued support of the international community so that we can

give Afghans the chance for peace and prosperity that they so deserve

our people
