The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

[Narrative:] The information about the Convention has been disseminated to the personnel of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) during the conduct of periodic Ammunition Surveillance and Firearms Inspection (ASFI) to AFP units. The same information is disseminated in courses on Ammunition and Explosives conducted by the AFP, Philippine National Police (PNP) and Philippine Coastguard (PCG) training institutions, such as the Ammunition Management and Explosive Ordnance Disposal of the Philippine Army and its equivalent in the PAF, PN, PNP, and PCG. Likewise, the provisions of the Convention are also disseminated to the civilian populace during Bomb Threat Procedures lectures to multinational companies and prominent business establishments.

The Philippines has no minefields, however, there are occasional reports of physical injuries and even deaths of a handful of individuals in the urban areas due to explosive remnants of war (ERW) or unexploded ordnance (UXO) from the WWII, and in the country-sides where the government forces have exchanged fires with the non-states armed groups (NSAGs).

A local non-government organization (NGO) based in Cotabato and a Swiss-based NGO in coordination with Mindanao-based AFP units in areas like Cotabato and Bukidnon are regularly conducting training/seminars/workshops to the civilian residents particularly on the landmine ban and other humanitarian issues including hazards posed by improvised explosives devices (IEDs) and unexploded ordnance (UXO) in their periphery.
