Pursuant to Article 7(1) d), Portugal would like to inform that the number of antipersonnel inert mines retained for EOD training purposes has been decreasing over the years.

From the 694 inert antipersonnel mines retained in DEC2010, currently, Portugal only retains 383 that are used for training purposes.

Annually, in this context, Portuguese Armed Forces EOD teams receive training in mine detection, clearance and destruction. The personnel deployed in international missions also receive basic training in mine awareness.
