In accordance with international mine action standards, the NPA further cancelled 3 suspected hazardous areas after the initial technical assessment 1 suspected hazardous area was reduced. After further technical assessment, all 4 of these areas were released in close dialogue with local communities. Battle area clearance was carried out in the only 1 remaining suspected area and revealed a small number of UXO that subsequently were destroyed. The evidence collected by NPA confirms there are no land mines in Malawi.

In accordance with international mine action standards, Norwegian Peoples' Aid cancelled all areas suspected to have APMs and, in close dialogue with local authorities, the areas have been officially handed over to the local communities as free of landmines and other explosive remnants of war. Following the verification by the Norwegian Peoples' Aid and UNDP that there are no land mines in Malawi nor suspected areas where mines are emplaced, Malawi is therefore a mine-free country. As such, there is no need to provide any warning whatsoever to the population presently.

After this consultative stage, it is expected that the Bill will be tabled in the next sitting of Parliament.
