NO				In 2007, an isolated incident involving a mine at the border with Senegal occurred. As a result the area was thoroughly checked and no other mines were found. Because of this incident and the unstable security situation at the border with Senegal, there may be other isolated incidents in the future. If such situation was happening and that previously unknown mined areas are discovered, the Gambia will report such areas in accordance with Article 7 and ensure the effective exclusion of civilians as well as the destruction of all antipersonnel mines in these areas as a matter of urgent priority.

Remark: In accordance with Article 5, para.2: "Each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplaced and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all anti-personnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".
