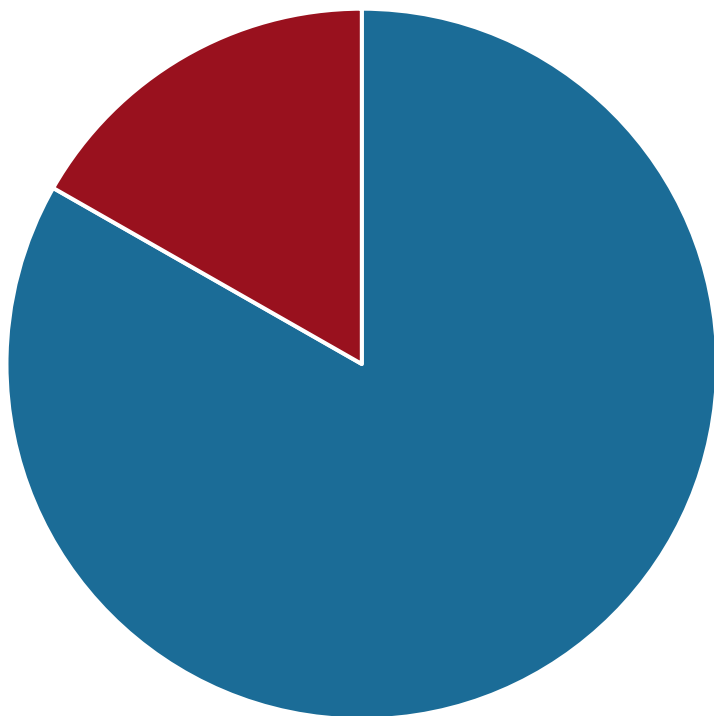
- Road Map to Implementation of the Convention

 - b. Universalization (Action 11 and 12)
 - c. Stockpile Destruction and Retention of anti-personnel mines(Action 13 -17)
 - d. Survey and clearance of mined areas (Actions 18 – 27)
 - e. Mine risk education and reduction (Actions 28 – 32)
 - f. Victim Assistance (Actions 33- 41)
 - g. Cooperation and Assistance (Actions 42 -47)
 - h. Compliance (Actions 48 – 50)

- Baseline established by the Coordinating Committee on implementation and presented to the Eighteenth Meeting of the States Parties.

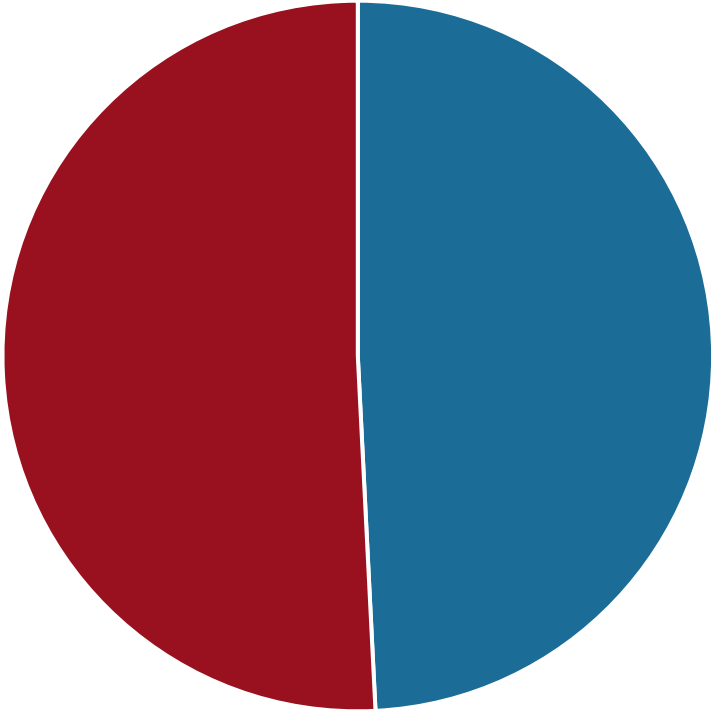

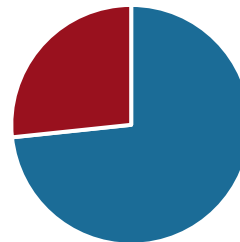

Stockpile Destruction



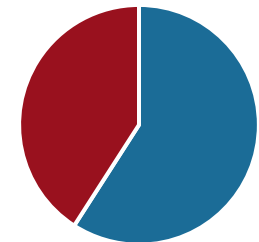

Oslo Action Plan – Action 8



Cooperation and Assistance

- Commit the resources needed to meet Convention obligations as soon as possible and explore innovative financing
- Disseminate information on challenges and requirements for assistance
- strengthen national coordination including by ensuring regular dialogue with national and international stakeholders on progress, challenges and support for implementation of their obligations under the Convention
- States Parties in a position to do so will provide assistance to other States Parties in the implementation
- States Parties in a position to provide assistance will, where possible using existing mechanisms, coordinate their support implementation of their obligations under the Convention
- Explore opportunities for cooperation, including international, regional and bilateral, cooperation between affected States Parties or South-to-South, with a view to voluntary sharing of best practices and lessons learned



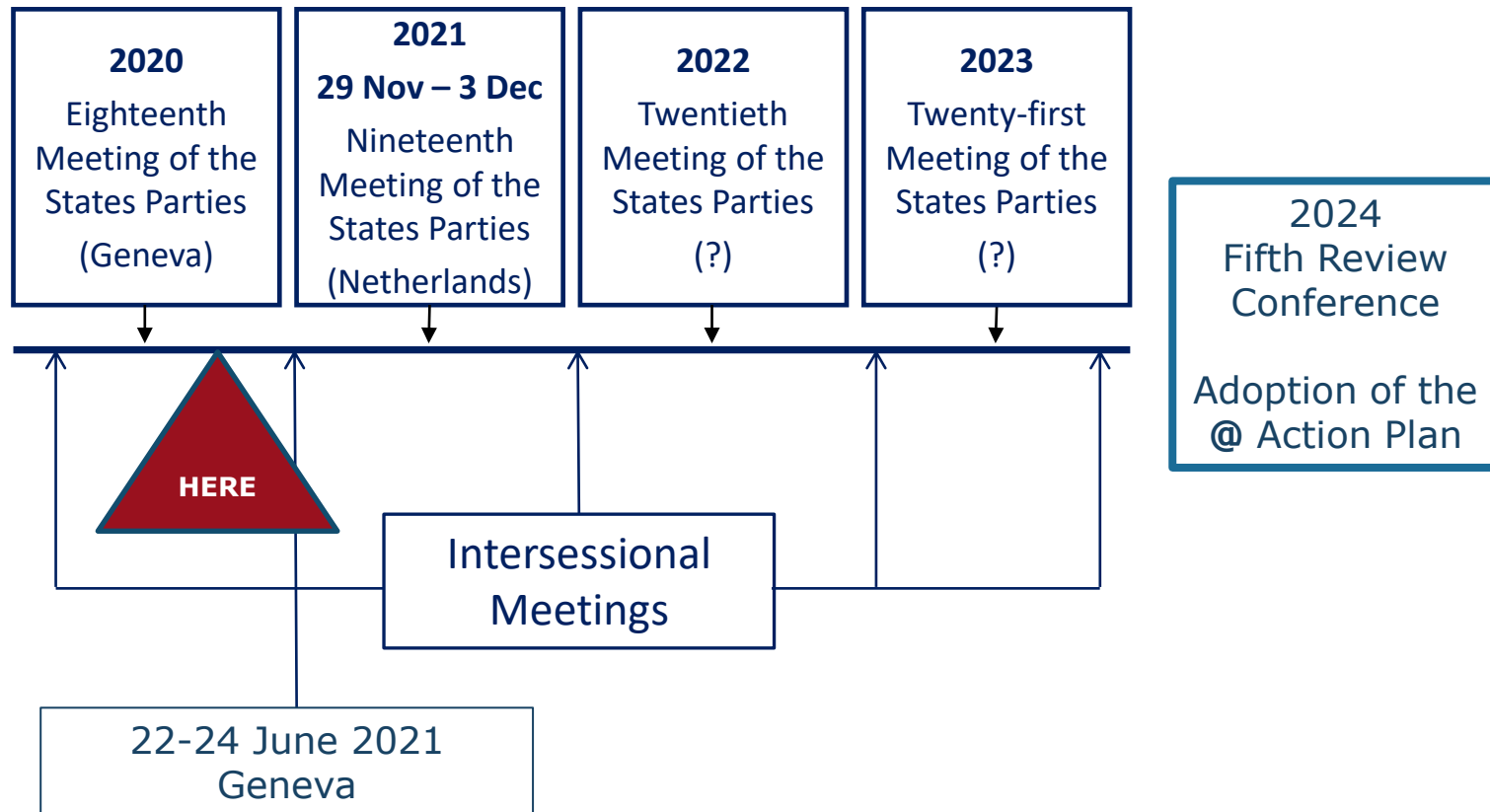
