Victim Assistance (VA)

What the Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Convention says:

- The Convention's preamble records the wish of the States Parties **“to do their utmost in providing assistance for the care and rehabilitation, including the social and economic reintegration of mine victims.”**
- This wish is translated into the obligation (Art. 6.3) of **“each State Party in a position to do so” to “provide assistance for the care and rehabilitation, and social and economic reintegration, of mine victims.”**

Maputo Action Plan

Action #18:

*"...report in advance of the next Review Conference on **measurable improvements** made in the well-being and the guarantee of the rights of mine victims, **challenges that remain** and **priorities for assistance** as relevant."*



VA in the context of the CRPD

The Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD) provides an overarching mechanism for mine survivors and it advocates that

- development programs should be inclusive of and accessible to persons with disabilities
- persons with disabilities should be integrated into all development activities rather than treating disability as a stand-alone thematic issue
- persons with disabilities must be recognised as equals




Applying a strategic approach to VA

1. Raise awareness
2. Assign responsibility for the process
3. Designate an inter-ministerial/inter-sectoral group
4. Analyse the situation
5. **Convene a national workshop / consult**
6. **Review the situation analysis**
7. **Develop SMART objectives**
8. **Develop a national plan and formulate a budget**
9. Integrate the national plan in broader work plans and budgets
10. Mobilise resources
11. Coordinate
12. Monitor and evaluate
13. Report



Taking an integrating approach

- There is an understanding that victim assistance should be integrated into broader national policies, plans and legal frameworks.



Inclusive Development

- It's about the process of ensuring the inclusion of persons with disabilities' rights and needs of any policies and programmes in all areas and at all levels
- For example, the UN Disability Inclusion Strategy (UNDIS) aims to *"...ensuring that the UN system is fit for purpose in relation to disability inclusion. It provides a foundation for sustainable and transformative change on disability inclusion through all pillars of the UN's work."*
